

Nominations Committee Report

The CPF NWT Board of Directors plays a major role in networking with other organizations to advocate on behalf of French-second-language learning, in policy development, and hiring the staff and holding that individual accountable for the work of the branch.

Ideally, the branch board, includes individuals with a variety of experience and expertise, representing a broad cross-section of the NWT French-second-language community. The bylaws state that the CPF NWT Board of Directors will consist of no fewer than five and no more than seven members. An attempt will be made moving forward to arrange the election of approximately half the board each year for a two-year term. In 2020, there are up to six (6) positions are open for election.
